What techniques and colours have you used and why?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Choose a successful critical reference from the 2 or 3 produced.</li> <li>Transfer the portrait using carbon paper or tracing paper. Bare in mind the style you are duplicating.</li> <li>Decide what surface you are going to work on. Link to and use the same as the critical reference. The options are white sketchbook paper/card black or white/grey card or watercolour paper.</li> <li>Paint/draw your application using the same media &amp; technique as the selected critical reference artist.</li> </ul>	Application based on chosen artist work.
<b>Week 5</b> A3 Portrait - Drawing up final piece	Enlarge Application	Applying paint to your final piece.	Have you recorded enough of the source image enlarged to A3 ready for painting?  What medium will you use on your painting and why?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Using the carbon paper draw up the A3 photo your teacher has provided.</li> <li>Press lightly so the drawing is not too dark! You do not want the lines to be visible through the paint in your outcome.</li> <li>Once traced redraw/'go over' the lines on the canvas carefully using a HB pencil to make the tracing</li> </ul>	A3 self portrait inspired by chosen artist.  Students will learn about the 'application process'. An application is where you are taking the artist's style and applying it to a new image.
